FINAL ORDER

I. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The above-captioned matter comes before the District of Columbia Board of Professional Engineering (hereinafter “the Board”) pursuant to the District of Columbia Administrative Procedures Act, 82 Stat. 1208; D.C. Official Code § 2-509 (2012 Repl.); D.C. Official Code § 47-2853.17 et seq. (2012 Repl.); D.C. Official Code § 47-2853.22 (2012 Repl.); D.C. Official Code § 47-2853.197 et seq. (2012 Repl.); and Title 17, Chapters 15 and 33 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (“DCMR”).

On or about October 27, 2015, the Board received a complaint regarding Francisco Bituin (“Respondent” or “Mr. Bituin”), a licensed professional engineer in the District of Columbia, License No. PE 10952.

On or about November 19, 2015, an investigation of the matter was requested by the Board, and commenced by the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs (“DCRA”).

The investigation was based on the appearance that Mr. Bituin had been convicted of a felony in the Commonwealth of Virginia.


On July 19, 2016, and in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 47-2853.20 (a) (2012 Repl.), Respondent signed and submitted a sworn affidavit in which Respondent voluntarily surrendered his license to practice as a professional engineer in the District of Columbia. Therefore, and in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 47-2853.20 (b) (2012 Repl.), the Board takes the following action:


II. ORDER


