
### **Site Description Summary**

Occupying more than 4,000 square feet of grassy flat land, this triangle park is found at the intersection of Blair Road, Butternut Street, and 4<sup>th</sup> Street NW. The site's location on a prominent corner, next to a neighborhood shopping center, and bus stops gives it high visibility. A broad cross-section of District residents and visitors walk past this tie due to its proximity to the Takoma Metro Station, making it a preferable location to commemorate a subject of interest to all residents.

### **Commemorative Opportunity**

Next to commercial uses and single-family homes, the site is suitable for a small to moderate size commemorative work viewed by passing pedestrians and vehicles and that serves as a local gathering space. The site is open to the adjacent sidewalk on two to three sides and a fourth side is defined by a solid wall of an adjacent building, making this a good site for a commemorative work that is visible from three sides.


During discussion of the application at the February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2021 meeting, the Commemorative Works Committee identified additional information needed for consideration as part of its review:

- Incorporate information on Javid into the commemorative work through an interpretive panel or digital media (ie. who he was, his importance, examples of his poetry, etc.);
- Provide additional information on the materials, fabrication, and finishes; and,
- Provide more information the scale of the bust (ie. will it be life-like?).

### **Second and Final Review**







- Placard placed beneath the commemorative work stating the name of the person commemorated, "Huseyn Javid," the dates of his birth and death, "1882-1941," his title, "poet and playwright," and a QR code.
- The QR code will lead directly to the section of the USACC website with a description of what the work represents, a real-life photo image of Javid, a link to an example of Javid's work, and mention of the artist.

### **Second and Final Review**





- The scale of the sculpture is increased by 50% from real-life size (1-1/2 times larger than a real-life scale)
- The sculpture is 2.1 ft in height (from bottom to top of hat), 1.65 ft wide (from placard to end of scroll), 0.5 ft deep (from placard to nose), and weighs 88.19 lbs.
