
#### Recap of Previous CWC Review

The Commemorative Works Committee previously provided comments to the applicant:

- 1. Provide a site plan for the statue that creates an outdoor space emphasizing the statue as it's focal point:
  - Include a landscape plan that simplifies the plantings around the statue.
  - Reconfigure the design the space at the corner of 24th and K streets so that it can entered from the sidewalk, is accessible, and creates a space where people can gather and view the statue and interpretive panel.
  - Include a specification for the interpretive sign that designed to be compatible with the materials used in the outdoor space.
- 2. Consider reducing the scale of the base so it is more compatible with the size of the statue.




Location Strategy Sites Throughout DC

#### The program will increase:


- Commemoration of Black Washingtonians and other local leaders of color in the District;
- Commemorative works beyond the monumental core, particularly in Wards 4, 5, 7 and 8; and,
- Capacity of under-resourced individuals and organizations to promote under-represented groups in commemorative works throughout the District.



Thomas Edison Bust – Only Memorial East of the Anacostia River

#### Addressing Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in Commemoration





- Most commemorative works located downtown and west of the Anacostia River in Wards 1, 2, 3, and 6
- Overwhelming majority of memorials recognize white men including subjects that participated in slavery, systemic racism, or suppressed equality
- More work is needed to diversify the subjects of commemoration in the District

There is a need to broaden commemoration to reflect the District's diversity of culture, race, gender or gender identify, sexual orientation, or disability status.
