	The webpage specifically dedicated to updates regarding the COVID- 19 vaccine. Consequently, the COVID-19 vaccine plan is tentative and continuously updated.	
	The District of Columbia will receive less than ten percent (10%) of vaccines for the District's health professional workforce of eighty-five thousand (85,000) individuals.	
	In addition, the District has limited capacity to store the Pfizer vaccine, which requires temperature control. Therefore, the District is building partnerships with hospitals to assist in immunizing staff at a designated hospital.	
	Dr. Onumah of the Pharmaceutical Control Division at DC Health is in communication with the District's pharmacist community to facilitate online enrollment to become a vaccine provider.

	This emergency rulemaking is necessary to continue to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the District's residents by reducing the spread of COVID-19 by establishing minimum standards for the safe and effective operation of pharmacies where pharmacists, pharmacy interns, and pharmacy technicians under the direct supervision of a pharmacist, participate in COVID-19 testing. This rulemaking further defines and addresses the location standards, distancing requirements, and use of personal protection equipment standards for the different types of COVID-19 testing, and expands the authority to participate in COVID-19 testing to pharmacy technicians.
