	Executive Director, Dr. Shauna White reported that the 114 <sup>th</sup> Annual	
	Meeting will be held in Denver, CO at the Hyatt Regency Denver Colorado	
	Convention Center from May 5-8, 2018. Board Member, Mr. Alan Friedman

Board Member, Benjamin Miles volunteered to be a part of the Item Writing Workshop. Executive Director, Dr. Shauna White also reported that the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) announced that they are in the final phases of development of a new, upgraded online system to serve the member boards of pharmacy and the schools and colleges of pharmacy as they utilize NABP programs and services. In addition, a new interface for individual pharmacists, technicians, and students registering for NABP programs are being developed. Both interfaces will be launched on April 2, 2018. Key features included in the first release of the system are as follows: •Eliminates all paper from the Electronic Licensure Transfer Program •New, two-step registration process for the North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination and the Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination puts the focus on boards' eligibility requirements •Redesigned e-Profile Connect interface provides intuitive, easy-to-navigate experience for users •Improved login system features self-service forgot password functionality with secure two-step verification •New online application process for the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Examination Committee Certification. **Continuing Education Audit** Motion: Board Member, Alan Friedman moved that the Board audit 20% of Pharmacists for the 2017 renewal audit. **Seconded by:** Board Member, Benjamin Miles **Motion Carried Assistant General** Carla Williams **Counsel Report** 0201-0-02 Defending Access to Woman's Health Care Services Amendment Act of 2017 (Bill B22-0106) Assistant General Counsel, Carla Williams reported that this bill will allow pharmacists to dispense certain contraceptives pursuant to established protocols; to amend the Women's Health and Cancer Rights Federal Law Conformity Act of 2000 to require insurers to cover certain health care services without cost-sharing, to require that insurers authorize dispensing of up to a 12-month supply of a pharmacist-dispensed self-administered contraceptive, and to require insurers to provide information regarding coverage to enrollees and potential enrollees. Ms. Williams further reported that the bill has moved forward and is pending with the Mayor. The Mayor's response is due on February 2, 2018. Once the bill comes back to the DC Council from the Mayor, then the bill will be submitted to Congress for review to become law.

0201-0-03	Opioid Abuse Prevention Amendment Act of 2017	
	Assistant General Counsel, Carla Williams reported that the act will limit initial prescription of opiates for acute conditions to seven days or less, create additional requirements for subsequent prescription of opiates for acute conditions, limit the strength of opiates for other than acute conditions, and require the Mayor to issue rules to limit dispensing of opiates prescribed out-of-state and track the number of prescriptions prescribed by practitioners. Ms. Williams further reported that there will be hearing before the DC Council on Monday February 12, 2018. If anyone wants to submit testimony or testify, you may contact the DC Council.
