- The session allowed YLA to hear from young people about the impacts of electronic monitoring and their lived experience. We learned about how it impacts youth and families. The participants elevated concerns with mental health, extensions of mass incarceration on the black community, and alternatives.
- YLA also had an opportunity to empower the participants by sharing why community youth voice was important to this work and why this effort matters. Powerful testimonials were shared.
  - Had voice recording and notetakers to capture the session, as well as photos
- New Instagram @ YLADCLeaders\_ pictures of YLA will be posted there
  - Also using platform to collect information via direct messages and to connect to other organizations both in and outside of DC
- Plan for additional focus groups to get additional feedback from impacted young people
- The Center for Coordinated Assistance to the States is supporting YLA's work, and YLA will present their learning at a conference in December
- YLA is enthusiastic about including adult JJAG members (limited numbers at each focus group to maintain appropriate ratios)
