Dr. McCants further reported the need to consider how the District of Columbia Board of Pharmacy can be on par with the rest of the country in terms of allowing pharmacists to administer medication. Other significant discussions at the annual meeting were focused on management of opioid use disorder and ways to expand the role of the pharmacy technician.
