<u>Office of Government Relations (OGR) Report Updates</u>	PrEP DC Act of 2025 <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Councilmember Parker introduced the <i>PrEP DC Act of 2025</i> (B26-0159) on February 28, 2025.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ The legislation creates safeguards for equitable and affordable access to HIV prevention treatment by prohibiting health insurers from using prescription information as a condition of eligibility or in premium rates, restricting or imposing setting delays in the distribution of antiretroviral prescription drugs, and from imposing a deductible, coinsurance, copayment, or other cost-sharing requirement for pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) or post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) to prevent HIV and AIDS infection.▪ The legislation has been referred to the Committee on Business and Economic Development with comments from the Committee on Health, but no hearing has been scheduled. Clean Hands Economic Expansion and Revitalization Amendment Act of 2025 <ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Councilmember McDuffie reintroduced the <i>Clean Hands Certification Economic Expansion and Revitalization Amendment Act of 2025</i> (B26-0054) on January 13, 2025.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ This legislation would remove the Clean Hands requirement from several occupational and professional licenses including any health professional license issued through DC Health.▪ A hearing was held on June 20, 2024. 	<p>DC Health FY 24 Performance Oversight Hearing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ DC Health recently had its performance oversight hearing in the Committee on Health for Fiscal Year 2024. ▪ The first part of the hearing was held on February 24th, 2025. That hearing featured public witnesses and included representatives from community members, advocates, and stakeholders. Testimony was provided by Director Bennett and other members of leadership and subject matter experts. Councilmembers asked questions of DC Health on a variety of topics including the agency's reorganization, school health, the launch of new programs, and the agency's response to emergency situations.
