<u>Government</u> <u>Relations (OGR)</u> <u>Report Updates</u>	 Councilmember Parker introduced the PrEP DC Act of 2025 (B26-0159) on February 28, 2025. The legislation creates safeguards for equitable and affordable access to HIV prevention treatment by prohibiting health insurers from using prescription information as a condition of eligibility; or in [the instance of] premium rates, restricting or imposing delays in the distribution of antiretroviral prescription drugs; and from imposing a deductible, coinsurance, copayment, or other cost-sharing requirement for pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) or post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) to prevent HIV and AIDS infection. The legislation has been referred to the Committee on Business and Economic Development with comments from the Committee on Health, but no hearing has been scheduled. 	
	 <u>Clean Hands Economic Expansion and Revitalization Amendment Act</u> <u>of 2025</u> Councilmember McDuffie reintroduced the <i>Clean Hands</i> <i>Certification Economic Expansion and Revitalization Amendment Act</i> of 2025 (B26-0054) on January 13, 2025. This legislation would remove the Clean Hands requirement from several occupational and professional licenses including any health professional license issued through DC Health.

	DCRx (DC Center for Rational Prescribing)			

- The Board of Pharmacy is working on a new contract with the DC Center for Rational Prescribing.
- The Board is currently structuring a new module titled *Self-Administered Hormonal Contraception*. More information regarding this module will be forthcoming as the process continues.

Working Conditions Update

- The Pharmaceutical Control Division has reviewed the comments submitted during the comment period and has made significant changes to the rulemaking.
- Consequently, the Pharmaceutical Control Division will meet with stakeholders on May 20, 2025 at 1:00 pm to review the revised, drafted and proposed rulemaking.
- The Board anticipates a meeting where feedback received from stakeholders will be incorporated in the revised and proposed rulemaking, which will be published in the DC Register.
- Retail/Front Line Pharmacists are encouraged to attend this meeting as it is important that they provide feedback and participate in structuring rulemaking that ensures safe pharmacy working conditions that are not challenging to the owners of pharmacies.

Pharmacy Facility License Renewal

- The licensure renewal period for resident and non-resident pharmacies opened on April 1, 2025 and will closed on May 31, 2025.
- The newly established online licensing portal will require that all first-time users are registered to use the portal before applying for licensure renewal.
- Please be advised that users who currently hold active professional licenses with the DC Board of Pharmacy are required to use a different email address when registering to use the online licensing portal for renewal of a pharmacy license.
