Questions by Vice Chair, Mr. Alan Friedman:

Two questions currently asked of pharmacists:

- 1. "Which vaccine should I get, Moderna or Pfizer?" Mr. Friedman reports on the recent opinion of a practicing physician who advocates for use of both vaccines. Mr. Medrano of the Washington DC Pharmacy Association supports the opinion that for maximum coverage, a combination of both vaccines should be administered to anyone receiving the COVID-19 vaccine.
- 2. Mr. Friedman asks Dr. Ortique about updates on administering Paxlovid. Dr. Ortique will research and inform Mr. Friedman of all updates once confirmed.

Board Chair, Dr. Tamara McCants encourages the pharmacy community to take advantage of registering for the vaccination and immunization program for children.
