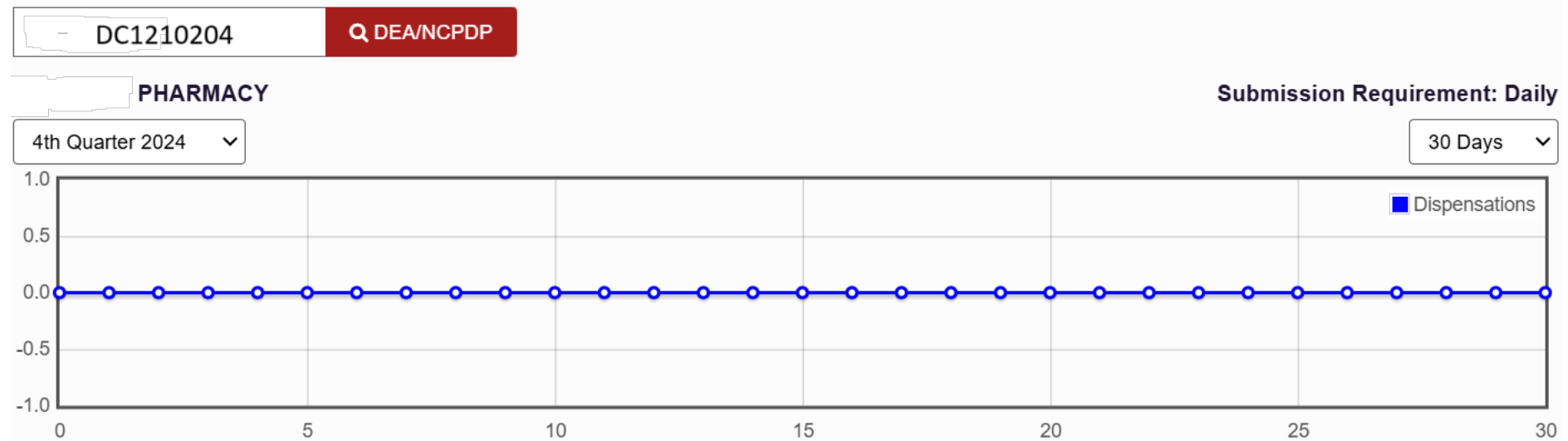

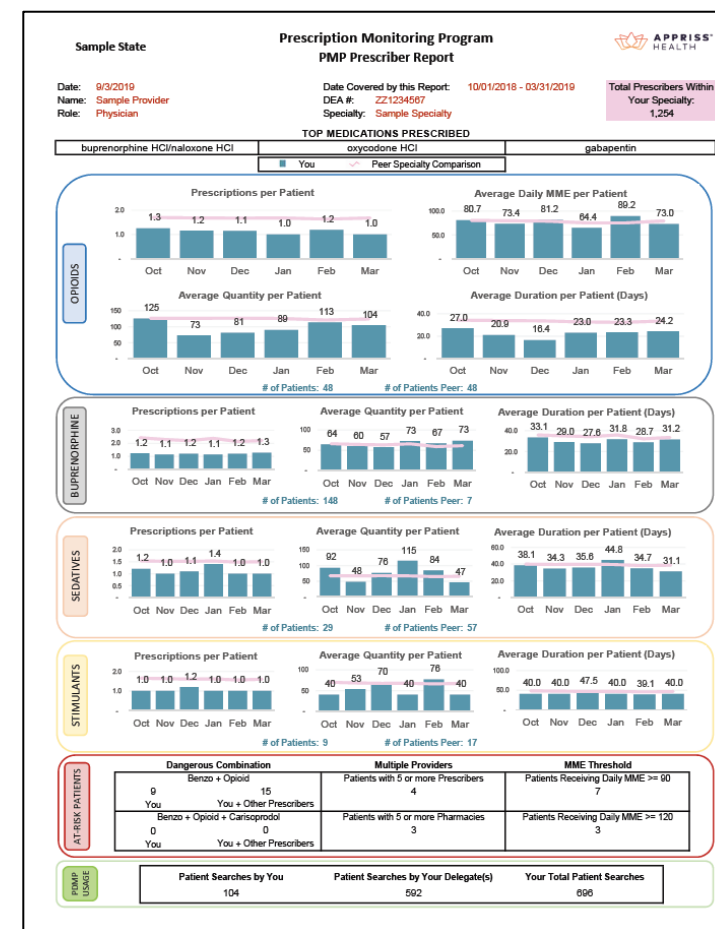

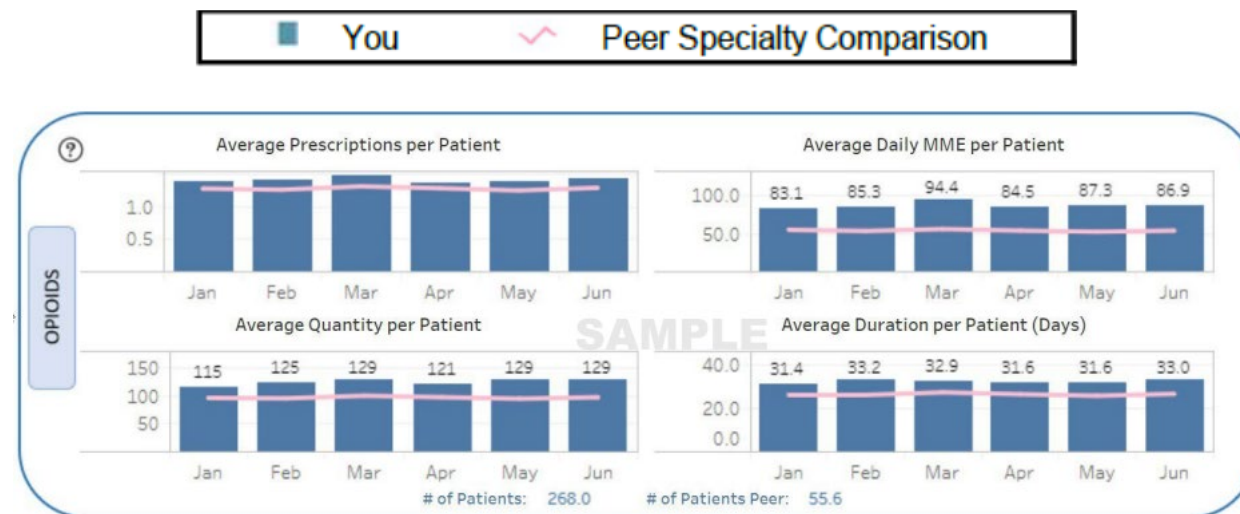
# Prescriber Reports

- Prescriber Reports provide a summary of practitioners' prescribing of covered substances\* over a 6-month period and present an opportunity for self-analysis as it relates to their prescribing of controlled substances
- Reports are sent quarterly
- Notice to >190 providers will be sent on 1/15/2025 to register a "Provider Specialty" to enable receiving Prescriber Reports



# Benefits of Prescriber Reports

- Provide prescribing patterns for opioids, buprenorphine, sedatives, and stimulants, along with peer comparisons.
- Identify patients at potentially elevated risk due to overlapping therapies, multiple providers, and higher MME thresholds.
- Indicate patient search activity, including searches performed by authorized delegate(s) made on the prescribers' behalf.

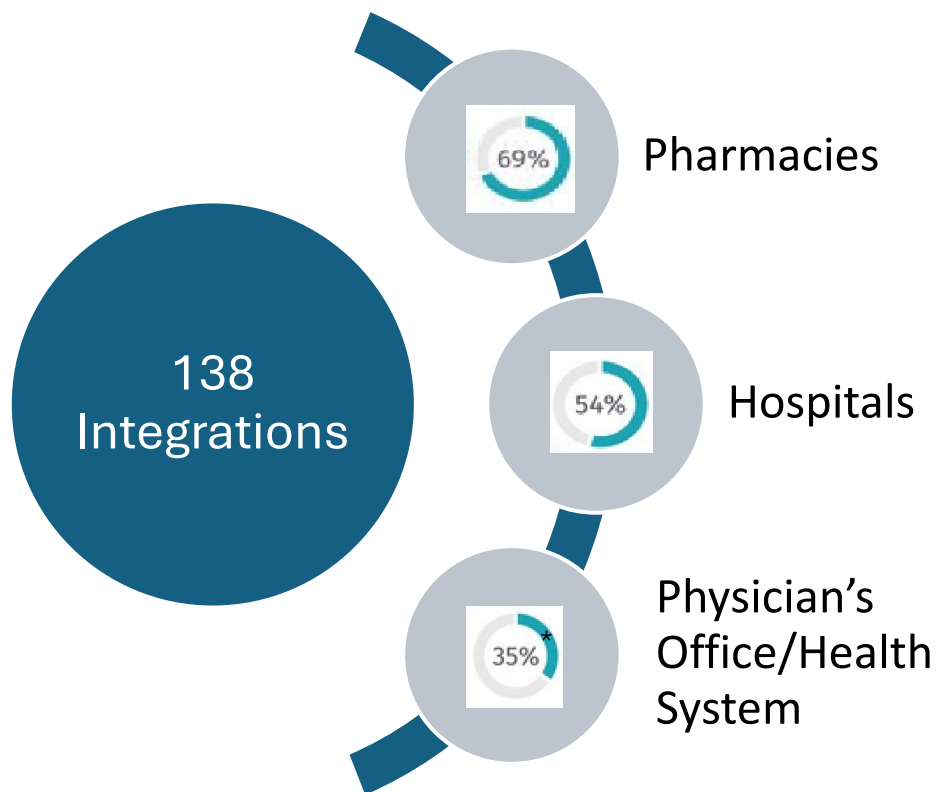

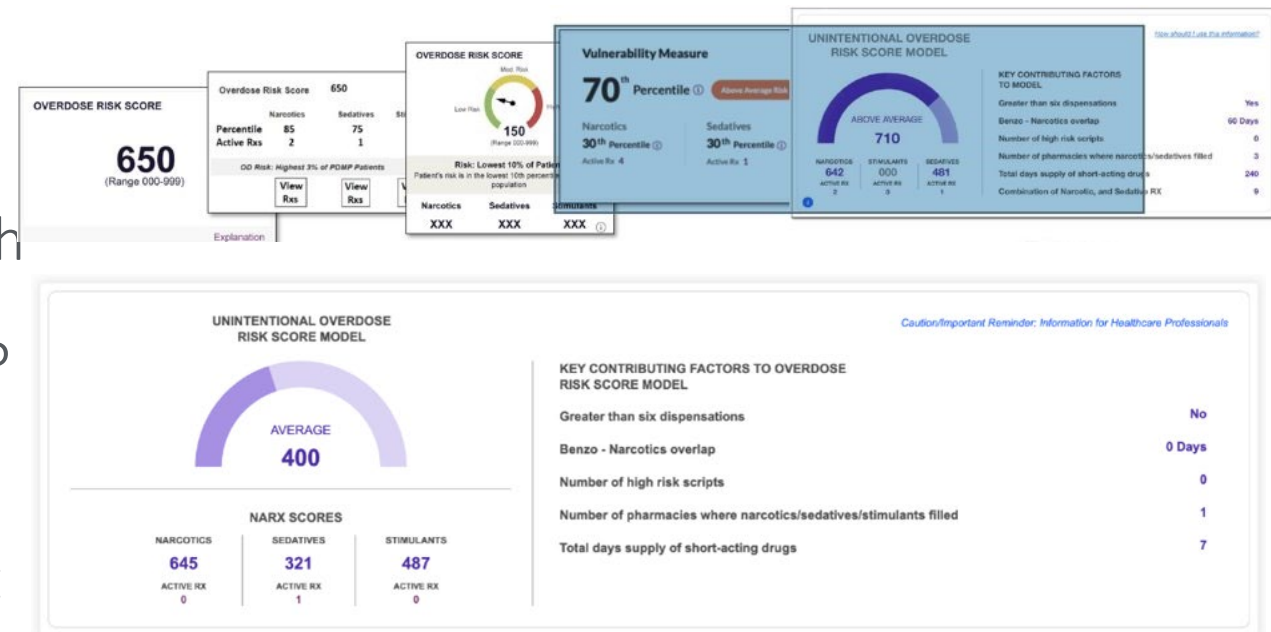

# Continuing Education

- DC PDMP is partnering with Howard University and DACS to offer a Continuing Education training for pharmacists and providers
- CE training will provide dispensers and prescribers with PDMP registration instructions and benefits of using DC PDMP
- After completing the training, participants will have a better understanding of PDMP report data, graphs and risk scores



# Findings

- Prescribers register as a requirement for initial licensing or renewal but may not access the database as required by law
- Many prescribers are not aware of the mandatory requirements to query the database and would benefit from formal PDMP training
- Prescribers can successfully prescribe without querying the database, leading to potential increased patient harm
- There is no method currently in place to monitor prescriber access history



# Potential Recommendations Based on Findings

- Create a Continuing Education (CE) training program for providers and dispensers registering for PDMP
- Require CE training for initial licensing and licensing renewals for providers and dispensers
  - Incorporate CE training into the required curriculum for relevant health licensing boards
  - Training would fall under the *Public Health Priority* category of “Responsible Opioid Prescribing and Effective Pain Management”

# What is Medication Therapy Management (MTM)?



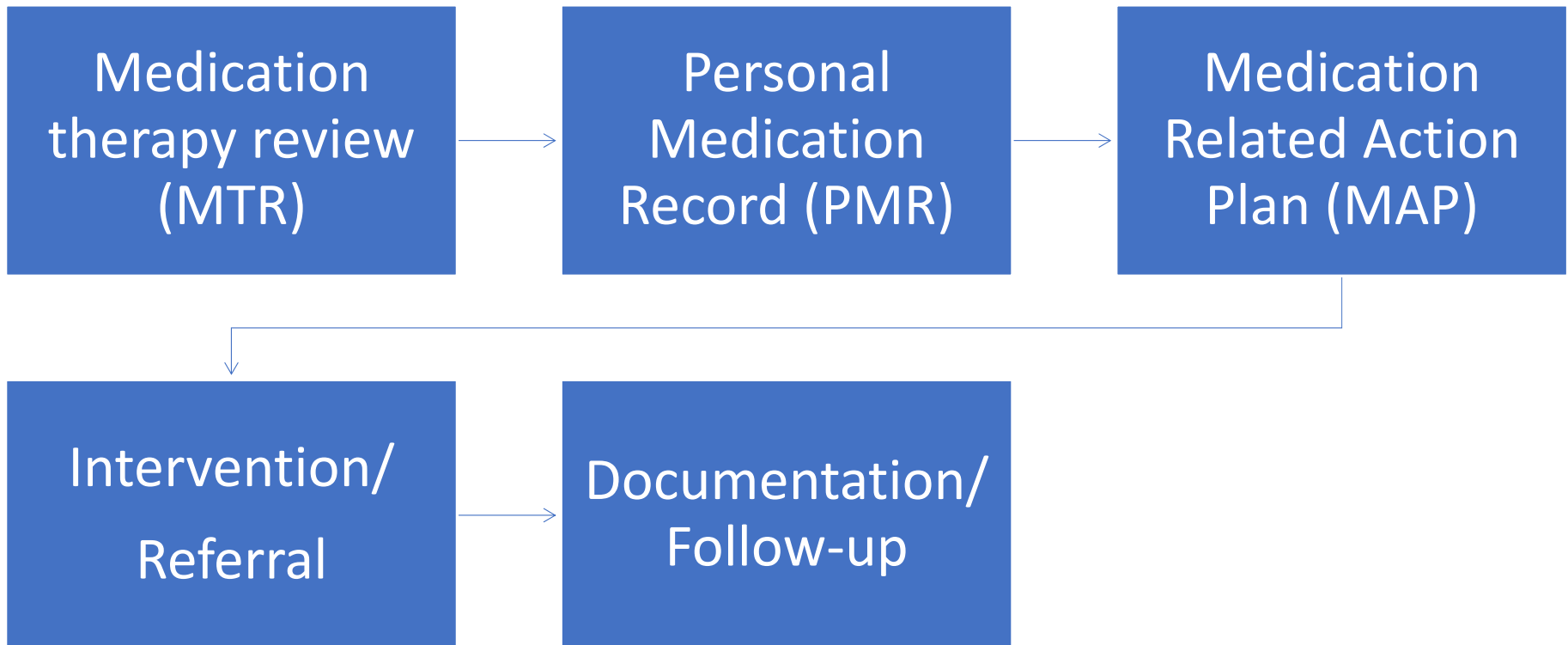
Medication therapy management (MTM) services focus on identifying, preventing, and solving drug-related problems to optimize therapeutic outcomes for individual patients.



MTM may be independent of OBRA-90 counseling statute and involves a thorough review of the patient's medications, including medication use history, medical history, and adherence to therapy to identify and resolve drug therapy problems with the patient and/or in collaboration with other health care providers.

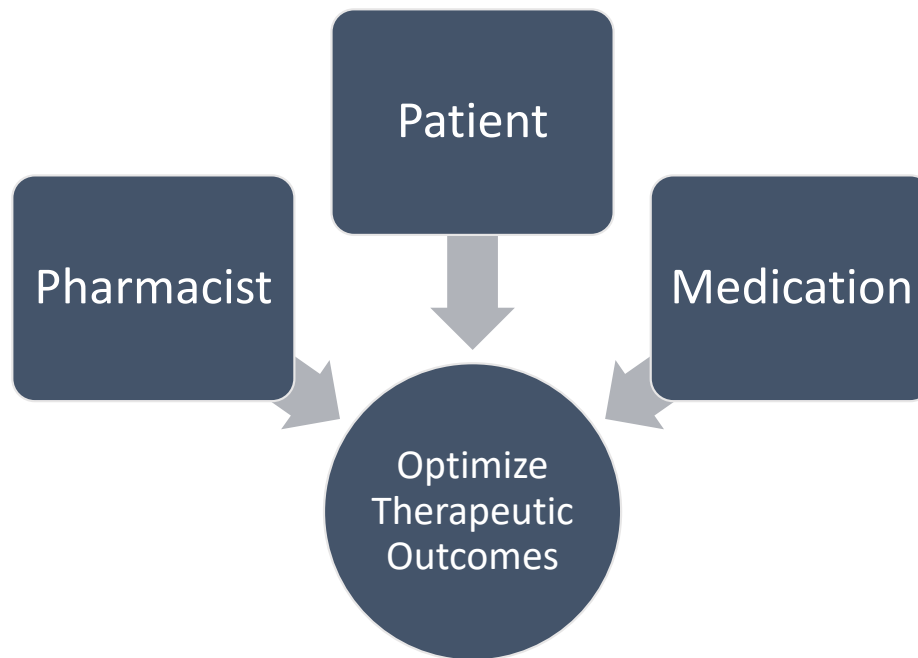

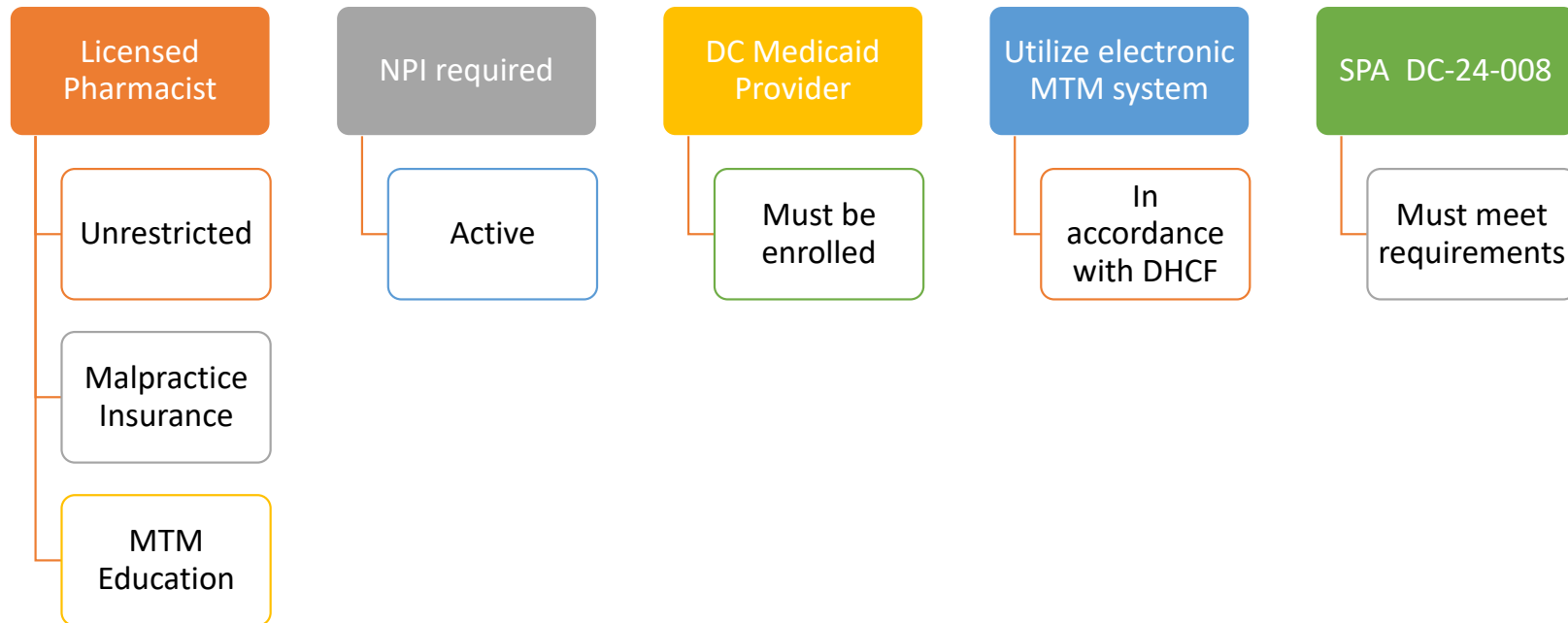

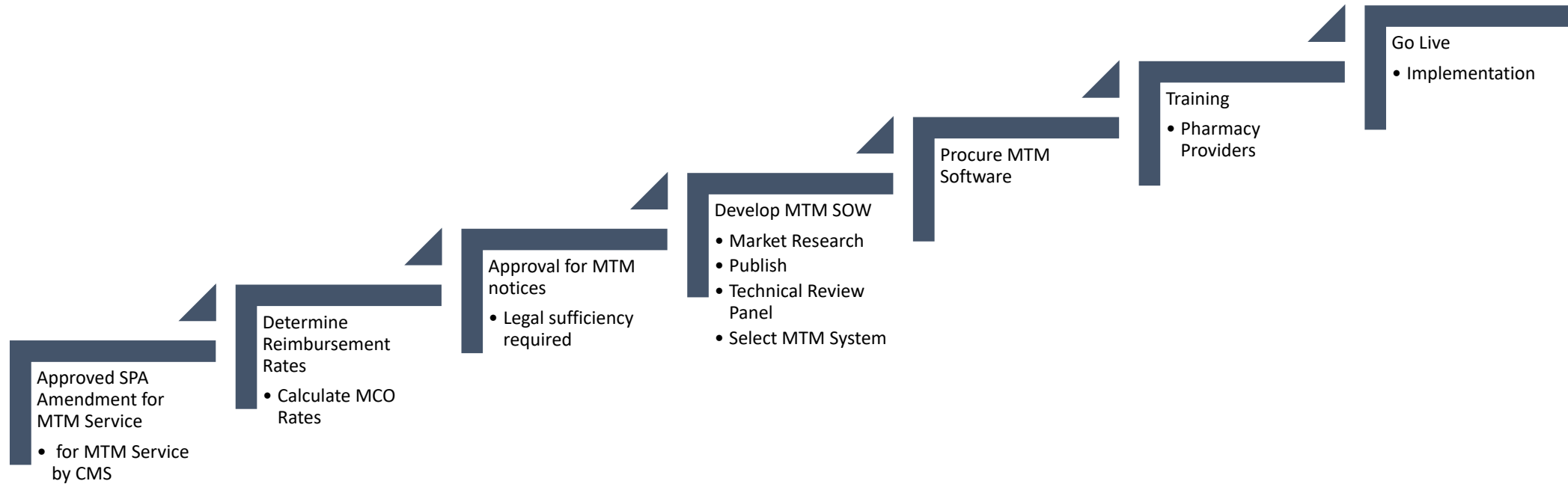

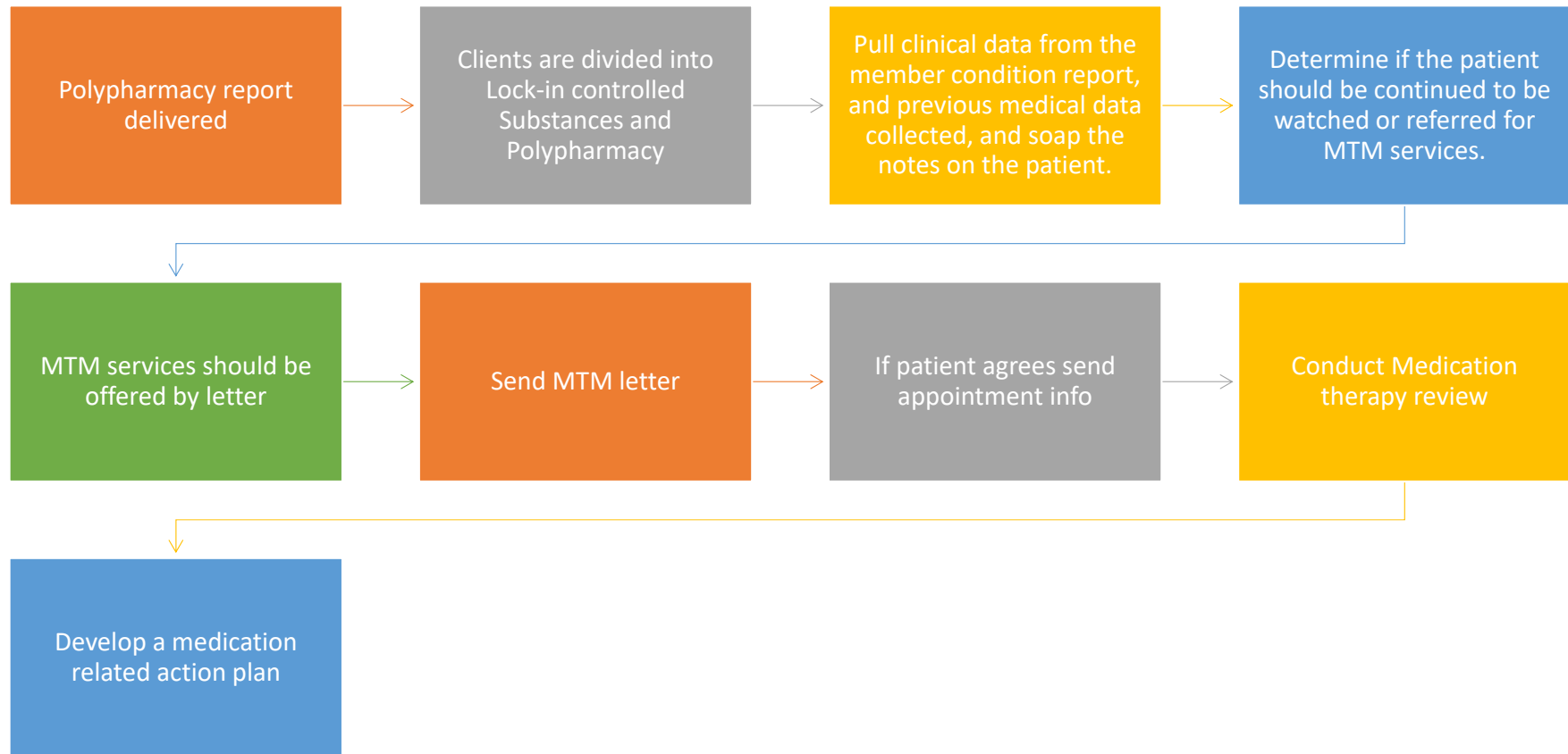

## FFS MTM Program's Current Implementation Status

- Procurement of MTM software for eligible pharmacy/pharmacist
  - Pending ETA late spring 2025
  - DHCF will approve eligible pharmacy/pharmacist providers meeting the criteria
- MTM reimbursement for services
  - Currently testing payor sheets for reimbursement at the pharmacy level for one-time MTM at the pharmacy level
  - Pharmacist provider type must be created
    - Pharmacist with collaborative practice vs Pharmacist as a consultant
    - Medical provider number
    - Pharmacist must have the medical system in place to bill as a medical provider
