Call to Order

A meeting of the Vision Zero Major Crash Review Task Force (MCRTF) was held remotely via Microsoft Teams on **Thursday, June 25, 2026**, at approximately 2:33 p.m. Attendees included the persons listed in the table at the end of this document. At least four of seven voting agencies were present, which constituted a quorum.

Introduction: Maris Fry (DDOT)

The new Vision Zero Dashboard is now available and accessible for the public (link provided).

The Vision Zero team (Rafael Moreno) provided the following 2026 mid-year summary: There were 20 fatalities in 2026, as of 6/23 which was 11 more (+122%).

The Motorcyclists data includes Motor-driven cycles (criteria). These vehicles are known as scooters or e-bikes. There has been a fatality that includes an e-bike that travels at a max of 30 mph.

On the long-term trend, we are above the 2025 levels, but below 2021, 2022, 2023, & 2024 levels. We expect to remain below 2023 & 2024 levels

There were 140 Major Injuries, 7 fewer than in 2025 (-5%). Bicyclists' Major Injuries decreased from 22 to 17 (-7%). Pedestrian Major Injuries decreased from 44 to 40 (-9%).

We are maintaining a consistent downward trend of major injuries since 2017 YTD.

In the last 12 months, there have been 36 fatalities among all road users, 19 fewer (-5%) compared to the prior 12-month period.

In the last 12 months, there have been 36 major injuries among all road users, 50 fewer (-14%) compared to the prior 12-month period.

The Task Force proceeded to crash review. Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 2-575(b)(1), which allows for closure of a meeting or portion of a meeting when a “law or court order requires that a particular matter or proceeding not be public,” the Task Force moved into a closed session because members specifically discussed the details of major crashes, which contained personally identifiable information and othersensitive material. The closed session involved review of review video and photographic records memorializing vehicular, pedestrian and other modal collisions and related fatalities, which may reveal images of such a personal and graphic nature that revelation in an open meeting would violate the personal privacy interests of the individuals involved.

Crash Review

During the closed session, the following crashes were reviewed:

A crash that occurred on 295 SB, prior to exit 2B SE, that occurred on February 6, 2026, around 3:21 am. (D26-06).

A crash that occurred at the intersection of 13th and Harvard St. NW on September 19, 2025, around 8:48 am. (D25-17).

A crash that occurred on the 2000 block of 21st st NW on September 26, 2025, between 2 am – 4 am (S25-19).
